MECCIR Standards: Methodological Expectations for Campbell Collaboration Intervention Reviews

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Background

- The Campbell Collaboration
 - Produces systematic reviews of credible evidence to inform policy and practice
 - Develops guidelines and standards for the conduct and reporting of systematic reviews (SRs)
 - MECCIR standards aim to reduce bias and error, increase transparency at each step in the review process




Context

MECCIR standards are part of a suite of Campbell guidelines and standards for SRs, including

MECCIR standards

- Adapted from Cochrane's MECIR standards
 (Methodological Expectations of Cochrane Intervention Reviews,
 Chandler et al., 2012)
- For SRs on *interventions* relevant for social and economic policy
- Separate standards for conduct and reporting of SRs



MECCIR conduct standards

- Steps to reduce bias and error in the review process: clear objectives, clear inclusion criteria, include unpublished studies that meet criteria, reliably extract data from studies, etc.
- 44 mandatory standards must be met prior to publication in the Campbell library
- 28 highly desirable standards should generally be met, but there are justifiable exceptions
- 4 optional items done at the authors' discretion



MECCIR reporting standards

- Steps to produce transparent, replicable systematic reviews: detailed description of search, screening, coding, analytic, and synthesis procedures
- 69 mandatory items
- 37 highly desirable items
- 2 optional items

 many of these standards are easily met
