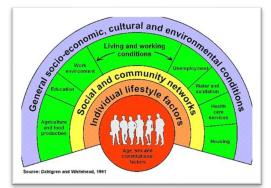

Mission and Overall Approach



- The <u>mission</u> of the IDEAL RRTC is to understand and enhance healthy aging for people with long-term physical disabilities—especially those at risk for poorer outcomes because of lack of resources, severity of disability, location, or other circumstances—through research and knowledge translation activities.
- The vision is of recognizing and addressing the social determinants that impact the health and healthy aging process for individuals with long-term physical disabilities.
- These include
 - Healthcare system, including access to care and knowledge of providers
 - Policies (state and federal)
 - Factors in the built and social environment
 - Crime and safety
 - Public transportation
 - Labor market conditions
 - Neighborhood characteristics



Objectives of IDEAL RRTC



- Identify environmental factors that are associated with healthy aging for individuals with long-term physical disabilities from diverse backgrounds, particularly those from low-income and racial / ethnic minority communities.
- Develop interventions to modify environmental factors to enhance the health, functioning, and participation of individuals aging with long-term physical disabilities.
- Serve as a national resource center by providing information, training, and technical assistance to a variety of groups / stakeholders.
- Engage key stakeholder groups, particularly disability and aging-related organizations, to bridge programs and practices for older adults and people with disabilities and to maximize the relevance and usability of the new knowledge generated by the RRTC.

Targeted Long-Term Outcomes



- Improve the environment, broadly defined, so it is more supportive to and inclusive of individuals with disabilities to promote healthy aging of adults with long-term disabilities and to allow enhanced access and opportunities towards this end.
- Enhance / promote / improve each of the following to ensure access by and relevance to individuals with physical disabilities:
 - Policies and programs
 - Attitudinal environments
 - Community planning and design
 - Healthcare systems
 - Physical activity and wellness programs
 - Public (and other) transportation

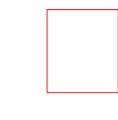
